
# PIRACY AND ARMED ROBBERY AGAINST SHIPS IN ASIA 2024



# **NUMBER OF INCIDENTS**

Compared to 2023 101 incidents 6% increase

## SEVERITY OF INCIDENTS

- Two CAT 1(very severe) incidents reported; first since 2020
  - · Perpetrators took crew hostage
  - Siphoned FAME (Fatty Acid Methyl Ester) cargo
- Bulk of the incidents involved 4-6 men
- More incidents involved perpetrators carrying knives and gun-like objects
  - Used to threaten the crew and not to harm
- Engine spares commonly stolen

## **ABDUCTION OF CREW IN SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH**



#### No incident reported in 2024

last known incident on 17 Jan 2020

#### Threat of abduction of crew

'MODERATE LOW' - 'Incidents are unlikely to occur due to perpetrators' perceived lack of capability to orchestrate an attack. Nevertheless, minimal damages are expected to the vessel and crew in case of an attack."

ReCAAP ISC Advisory - ships to exercise vigilance & adopt necessary preventive measures while transiting the area
